Our parish is participating in a Spiritual Adoption Program until next June. We ask that you pray for children that were wanted and prayed for and also for those that may have been conceived unexpectedly. We pray for parents who are considering abortion and for those parents considering an adoption plan. **Conception: I'm Here!** At the moment the nuclei of the father's sperm and the mother's egg unite a new and unrepeatable human being comes into the world, complete with his or her own unique set of DNA. The new little person's sex is also determined from the beginning. This tiny human begins her life as a single cell gliding down the fallopian tube. In just a few days, she will snuggle into the soft lining of her mother's womb where she will be nurtured for about nine months. After birth, she will play a unique role within her own family, and community – a role only she can fulfill. All she needs is time, nourishment and, most of all, love.
