Month 2 "I'm dancing!"

The developing baby is now called a "fetus," which is Latin for "little one." She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry News

Food insecurity reaches all age groups. 35% of the people we serve come from the 35-59 age group (the largest age group served by the pantry). The second largest group is the 0-17 years – 23%. 13% of the pantry visitors come from the over 60 age group. The median monthly household income is only \$813.00 (\$9,760.00 annually) for the people using Ohio pantries. The number of households using St. Vincent de Paul Pantry continues to grow. In October the pantry serviced 245 households representing 717 people.

For Christmas, we are asking each parish family to make a Christmas gift to the pantry either by donating canned fruit, soup or personnel items – especially toilet paper; or by making a financial donation to the pantry by making checks payable to St. Vincent de Paul (designate Food Pantry in the memo) and mail to SVdP Food Pantry, 135 Wilson Street, Newark.

Christmas can be a really difficult time for the families using the food pantry. Help us alleviate some of the burden on these families by donating to the pantry. Thank you for your continued support.
