**Month 5 “Mommy felt me kick today!”**

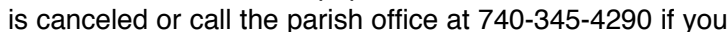

### St. Edward Fish Fry

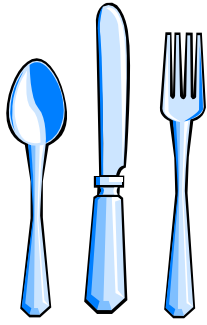

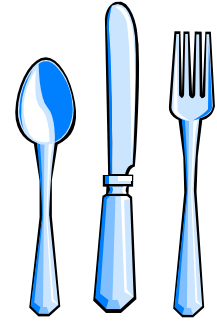
### St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry News
