Catholic Youth Summer Camp: This weekend, we welcome Christie Jenkins, from Catholic Youth Summer Camp, to speak to us about this amazing opportunity for our middle school and high school students. As we pray for the renewal of our parish, we need to make the evangelization of our youth a top priority. CYCS is a great help in leading our children to open their hearts to an encounter with Christ and an openness to the Holy Spirit.

Flocknote: Are you registered with Flocknote? Do you receive emails? Texts? If so, please sign up! You can easily do so by visiting our parish website at www.blsac.net and click on the link that says "Join Flocknote." Flocknote provides a great way for us to improve our communication as a parish.

Pray for the dead: During November, we are reminded about the importance of praying for the dead. As an encouragement to do this, the church offers a plenary indulgence if we visit a cemetery on the days between November 1st-8th. During our visit, it is presumed that we will pray for the souls. The usual conditions for obtaining a plenary indulgence apply: To obtain the plenary indulgence on November 1-November 8, we must receive Communion and sacramental Confession (and have no attachment to sin, even venial). Communion must be received each day we wish to gain the indulgence, but we only need to go to Confession once during the period. A good prayer to recite to earn the indulgence is Eternal Rest, though any formal or informal prayer for the dead will suffice. And, as with all plenary indulgences, we must pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary) each day we perform the work of the indulgence. I also encourage you to add this simple prayer to the conclusion of your prayer before meals: "May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace." My grandparents faithfully added this prayer to every prayer before meals. Praying for the dead is a work of charity that, hopefully, someday others will offer to us.

Pancake Breakfast: Join us next weekend for our first fund raiser for the March for Life. We will be hosting a pancake breakfast Sunday morning, November 13. There is more information in the bulletin. It is a great breakfast for a great cause!
