



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Corpus Christi: Today, we celebrate the great solemnity of Corpus Christi; we celebrate the gift of Jesus of His Body and Blood. This is very special feast for us at Blessed Sacrament. St. John Paul II wrote beautifully about the Holy Eucharist on many occasions. Here is

one quote from his letter *Ecclesia de Eucharistia (The Church from the Eucharist)*, which he wrote in 2003: "When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, the memorial of her Lord's death and resurrection, this central event of salvation becomes really present and "the work of our redemption is carried out." This sacrifice is so decisive for the salvation of the human race that Jesus Christ offered it and returned to the Father only after He had left us a means of sharing in it as if we had been present there. Each member of the faithful can thus take part in it and inexhaustibly gain its fruits. (*Ecclesia de Eucharistia* 11)

Father's Day: I want to wish all of fathers in Blessed Sacrament Parish a very happy and blessed Father's Day! There is much confusion in our culture today about what it means to be a true man and what it means to be a father. I commend to all of the men in our parish the model of St. Joseph. I am very pleased that we have our "Holy Family Shrine" with a statue of St. Joseph, which combines two aspects that we have traditionally focused on: St. Joseph the Worker with his carpenter's tools and St. Joseph the Chaste Spouse of Mary, with the flowering staff of white flowers representing his chastity. I commend the letter of St. John Paul II on St. Joseph written in 1989: **REDEMPTORIS CUSTOS: ON THE PERSON AND MISSION OF SAINT JOSEPH IN THE LIFE OF CHRIST AND OF THE CHURCH.** In "Five Lessons From St. Joseph," author Randy Hain points out attributes of St. Joseph that help establish him as a model for all fathers: 1) St. Joseph was obedient. 2) St. Joseph was selfless. 3) St. Joseph led by example. 4) St. Joseph was a worker. 5) St. Joseph was a leader.

We have a number of opportunities in the parish to help men become more who God calls us to be. I encourage the men in our parish to participate in our monthly "Into the Breach" Saturday morning meeting and our monthly "Band of Brothers" meeting on a Tuesday evening for faith formation opportunities. Our Knights of Columbus Council #721 and our Holy Name Society offer the men of our parish the opportunity to put our faith into action.

BAA Update: I want to thank the 154 households who have pledged to the annual Bishops Annual Appeal for a total of \$41,783.34. This represents 27.2% of our parish helping us to reach 70.2% of our goal of \$59,487.32. We have \$17,703.98 to reach our goal. I am especially grateful for those who have responded to BAA as many of us continue to make our monthly payments on our pledge for the restoration of our church. Safety and Security: As part of our ongoing effort to make prudent steps to promote a greater sense of safety and security, we have made several decisions. In order to increase a sense

of security for our adorers, we are now locking the doors of the church during the Adoration hours on Monday and Wednesday. During our Tuesday "Holy Hour," from 5:00-6:00 p.m., the doors of the church will remain unlocked as we have confessions and evening Mass. Our east side door is equipped with a key card access. All parishioners are welcome to get a key card by contacting the parish office regardless of whether or not you have a regular hour for Adoration. Parishioners and those wishing to spend time in Adoration may knock at the door on the east side of the church during Adoration hours. Also, we have established a Parking Lot Hospitality Ministry to welcome and greet parishioners as they enter church for our Sunday and Saturday evening Masses. This ministry will also help promote the overall safety of our parishioners in a variety of ways.

Fortnight for Freedom: Each year, dioceses around the country arrange special events to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom. The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21 – the Vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More – to July 4, Independence Day. Through bulletin inserts and special prayers of the faithful at the Sunday Masses during the Fortnight, we hope to keep alive the need to pray for Religious Liberty in our nation and throughout the world.

Msgr. Susi's Ciborium: I want to thank the family of Msgr. Susi, who donated to Blessed Sacrament Church his ciborium. A ciborium is a sacred vessel that is used to distribute the Body of Christ. As many of you know, Msgr. Susi was a son of our parish who served for many years as a priest in Louisiana. We have had his ciborium refinished and it has been in regular use during our Sunday Masses. This beautiful ciborium helps to add dignity to our celebration of the Holy Mass, is a reminder of the faithful service of a son of our parish, and hopefully will be an inspiration for more young men to come forward from our parish to dedicate their lives to the service of God and the People of God.
