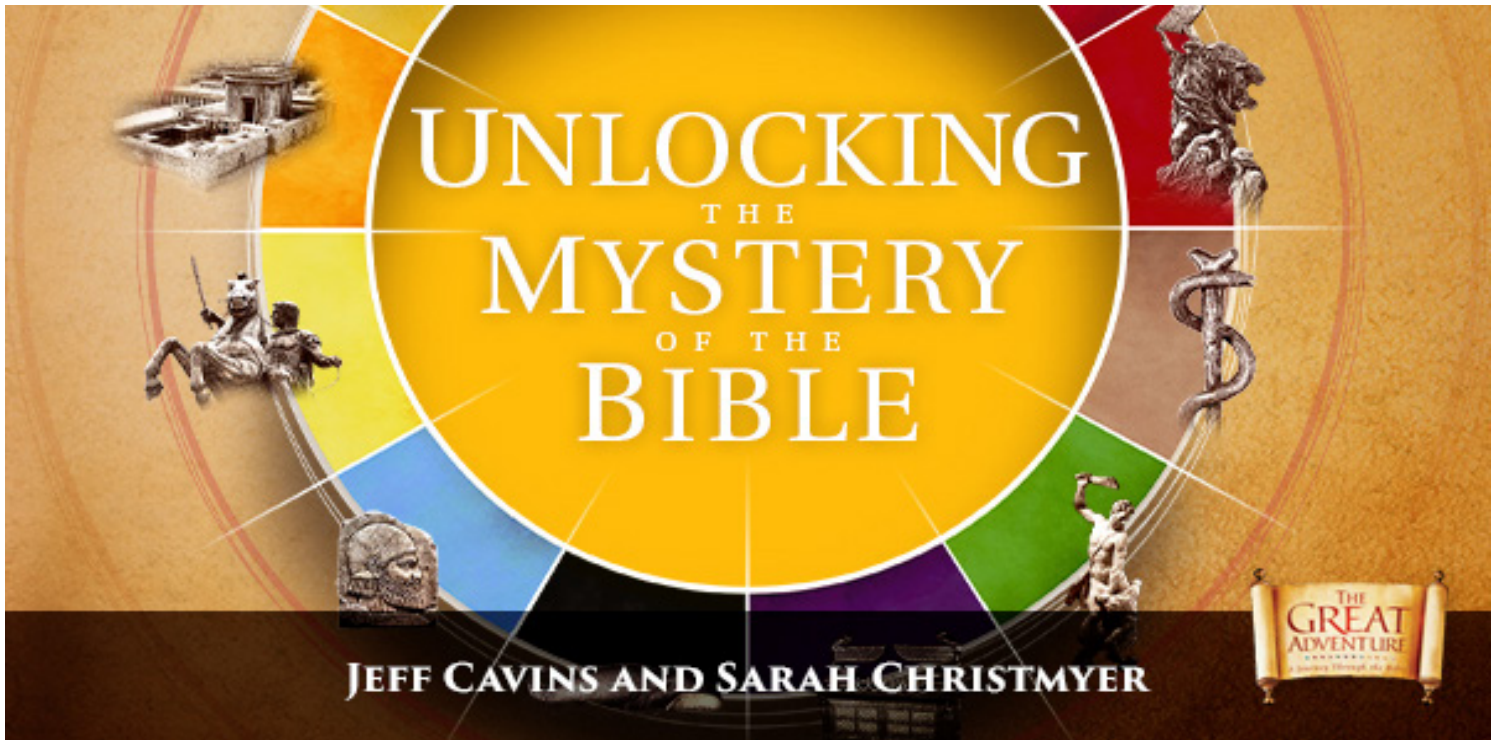

Cemeteries Update

Here are some updates on the Catholic cemeteries of Newark, St. Joseph, St. Route 13 N. and Mt. Calvary, St. Route 13 S.

March 1st is the spring cleanup so the grounds are ready for the mowing season. No artificial decorations of any kind are allowed from March 1st through November 1st.

Current prices were established six years ago, and since then our needs have changed. The cost of materials and maintenance continues to rise, and the need to put aside funds for perpetual care is always present. We have also begun long-deferred maintenance on the buildings, grounds, equipment and are charting a course for future capital improvements. With analysis and collaboration among our Cemetery Association, we have established a new price list. As we keep an eye on our needs and on the policies of other parish or diocesan cemeteries, prices will be reviewed annually.

Effective March 1st new prices are as follows: Grave space – \$800.00; Burial of casket and vault – \$800.00 (Saturday – \$900.00); Burial of ashes – \$525.00 (Saturday – \$600.00); Concrete foundations for monuments: 60 cents/square inch.
